DEPTH GAUGE FOR DRILLING

Sometimes you need to drill a number of holes all to the same depth. One quick and easy way to do this is to wind some tape around the drill bit so that the tape just touches the part surface when the hole is deep enough.

You can set the depth either by measuring from the tip of the drill to the tape or by drilling to the correct depth, leaving the bit in the hole, and wrapping tape around the bit at the surface level.

Note that a little extra tape left free on the end will blow away debris from the drilling.




CUTTING A BOLT

Whenever you have to cut a threaded bolt shorter, it's often difficult to get the nut to thread back onto it. And the smaller the bolt, the more difficult it is to restore any distorted threads. The problem is easily solved with the use of a nut. Here's how I do it.

First, screw a nut onto the bolt before cutting it. Grip the bolt by the threaded section that is to be sawed off. Then saw the bolt to the desired length, taper the end with sandpaper or file, and unscrew the nut from the bolt.

Unscrewing the nut over the freshly cut end of the bolt will straighten out any damage that sawing and filing did to the threads. Gripping the bolt by the piece to be sawed off localizes any crushing damage to the piece that will be thrown away.

ROCKHOUND ROUNDUP



An Official Field Trip of the Tampa Bay Mineral and Science Club (Tampa, FL)

Saturday, January 11, 2020 Vulcan Limestone Mine 16313 Ponce De Leon Blvd, Brooksville, FL Meet no later than 8:45 AM Eastern Time Collecting 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM Eastern Time

TRIP: This quarry has abundant Oligocene marine fossils as well as interesting rocks and minerals.

COLLECTING: Echinoids (fossil sand dollars and urchins), druzy calcite crystals, and chert for cabbing. There are shark teeth but seldom found.

BRING: This is surface hunting, so digging tools are not necessary, other than a screw driver or butter knife to pry fossils from dirt. A rock hammer is helpful at times if you want a piece of chert. We park at the hunting site, so you can leave your lunch, drinks and cooler in the car. Sun screen might be handy. Bring drinks and snacks as we stay until 12:00 noon and/or 2:00 PM.

REQUIREMENTS: Sturdy closed shoes or sneakers, no sandals or open toed shoes. Jeans or long pants are preferred to protect your knees and long sleeve shirt or sun screen. If it is a bright day, a hat or ball cap would be useful.

FEE: No Fee.

REGISTRATION: No registration required.

CHILDREN: Children are allowed but must be under adult supervision at all times.

PETS: No pets allowed.

FACILITIES: The one thing they do not have is a restroom, stop at the gas station in Brooksville before you arrive.

DIRECTIONS AND WHERE TO MEET:

The meeting time will be 8:45 AM as we go into the mine in convoy at 9:00 AM. The gates are locked behind us so don't be late. If you are unavoidably detained, call Fred Hendershot (813-892-5864).

Take I-75 to exit #301, Brooksville, Florida. Go ten miles into Brooksville and follow Rt. 98. It will turn north in town and go another ten miles north. The Vulcan/Cemex signs are on the left (the Cemex sign is larger and easy to spot). Park in the large field and sign the Vulcan liability waiver.

RSVP if planning to attend

TRIP: This is an old alluvial deposit containing rocks eroded from the Appalachian Mountains since their formation 400 million years ago. This site is an old gravel quarry that is now producing natural gas field.

COLLECTING: Material at Brookwood is primarily water smoothed pebbles of mixed size from teeny to baking potato size. We will be looking for petrified wood, jasper, agate, blue crazy lace, and oolite. This site has an abundance of water smoothed quartz pebbles shaped like a double-sided cabochon. Small amounts of many other types of rock are found including petrified wood, jasper, agate, marine fossils, Indian paint pots and any number of other unknown materials. Lots of great tumbling material but some is suitable for cutting.

BRING: Sack lunch, plenty of drinks, buckets or bags for specimens, hammer, screwdriver (or something similar to pry the rock out of the surface). No real digging involved although people bring shovels to put many rocks into their buckets. Limit two 5 gallon buckets. Wear appropriate dress, hat, good gloves, and sunscreen.

CHILDREN: Kids are allowed with adult supervision. This trip is not recommended for children under 5 years old.

PETS: No pets allowed.

FACILITIES: There will be a port-a-potty available.

TERRAIN & ACCESSIBILITY: It is fairly level with some hills if you choose to climb. It should not be a problem for people with mobility issues. People can park right at the areas they want to collect.

REQUIREMENTS: All tools, equipment, and ponds are strictly off limits. The AFMS/SFMS code of ethics should be strictly observed (click here to read them). The property owner has been generous to let us collect here for many years and we would not want anything to jeopardize that.

WAIVER FORMS MUST BE SIGNED BEFORE YOU DIG!!!

Please check in at the club table when you arrive at the site and before you leave so we can keep count of who is there. We do not want anyone to get locked in the gate!!

EVERYONE MUST BE OUT OF THE SITE BY 3:00 P.M.


