The motion passed which included a go ahead for the show.

Vivian Meloft made a motion to have Jinger Glasgow replace Don Rosenstiel as board member at large. John Wild seconded and the motion passed.

Jim Thomas wants to lead some field trips. He would like to go to Second Creek/Wheeler Dam soon. He also has a boat and wants to go for looking for shark's teeth. A trip to Graves Mountain for a club only dig is also being looked at. Sandra may have a new Brookwood location to dig in a tailings pile. This would require a UA geologist and an EPA representative.

Levan Foster and Cathy Kellogg have been talking about an online auction to replace our usual April auction. This can be done on zoom or facebook. It was recommended that we have 20-30 high quality items for best results. Members donating items are asked to give a detailed description. We may need to get a PO Box.

Richard Mc Contha said he had 15-20 pounds of petrified wood he would like to donate to the club. Thanks!

Robert reported that his eyes are healing from recent cataract surgery and he hopes to get the shop open again soon.

Reggie has been in touch with Benjamin Beadore who is interested in participating in the club but could not make it to this meeting.

Cathy moved that we transfer up to \$10,000. incrementally to cover the show deposit and other expenses. Robert seconded it and the motion passed.

Side note - we paid for two show insurance policies which we hope will carry over to our next shows. Door prizes were not given out because Levan and Yvonne Foster couldn't make it to the workshop. The meeting was adjourned.

Brad Smith - Bench Tips ~

SHARP KNIVES FOR CUTTING MOLDS

Cutting molds is easier and more precise with a sharp blade. A new Xacto blade is sufficient for cutting RTV molds but is usually not sharp enough for vulcanized rubber. For that it's best to use scalpel blades available from most jewelry supply companies.

The #11 blade is triangle shaped, and the #12 is hawksbill shaped. I find the hawksbill is particularly nice for cutting the registration keys of the mold.



USE YOUR THUMB

When using multiple bits in a Foredom, we often have to deal with several different shaft sizes - the usual 3/32 inch burs, the larger 1/8 inch shafts sizes and of course the many different sizes of drills. For some reason I really dislike having to turn the key multiple times to open or close the jaws of the handpiece chuck.

So I have two ways to speed up that task. For opening up the jaws, I just remember "four", the number of turns I have to make to open the chuck just enough from the 3/32 bur shaft size to the larger 1/8 bur shaft size.

For closing the jaws around a smaller shaft, there's a neat trick. Hold the new bit in the center of the open jaws of the chuck, put your thumb lightly onto the outer toothed collar of the chuck, and gen-



tly start up the Foredom. As the chuck turns, it will naturally tighten the jaws around the bur shaft or the drill bit. Then all you have to do is a final tightening with the key.

BTW - I am offering a couple online jewelry making workshops in March that may be of interest to some of your members. Meteor Shower Alert April 22, 2021, before dawn, the Lyrids

The Lyrid meteor shower – April's shooting stars – lasts from about April 16 to 25. About 10 to 15 meteors per hour can be expected around the shower's peak, in a dark sky. This year, the best time to watch may be the hour or two between moonset and dawn. The Lyrids are known for uncommon surges that can sometimes bring the rate up to 100 per hour. Those rare outbursts are not easy to predict, but they're one of the reasons the tantalizing Lyrids are worth checking out. The radiant for this shower is near the bright star Vega in the constellation Lyra (chart here), which rises in the northeast at about 10 p.m. on April evenings. In 2021, we expect the peak viewing to take place in the dark hour before dawn April 22, after moonset.
