John Wild reported that the Franklin, NC show was disappointing. Many of the usual vendors were not there. He did, however, buy some geodes for cracking at our show. Also, two shows he was going to participate in have been cancelled. If any of our vendors back out at the last minute, we will apply their deposit to a future show. If the show is cancelled due to covid refunds will be paid.

Christina Tela offered the use of her vehicle to transport club items between the workshop and the Civic Center. John Wild continues to work with Steve Adams on the website. The main goal right now is to get show info up.

Various members continue to try to reach Cahaba Heights United Methodist Church about a meeting place.

Door prizes were distributed and the meeting was adjourned.

JUST A DROP

Hobby shops and model airplane stores carry small plastic dispenser bottles that are handy for putting a drop of flux, oil, or glue just where you want it. They have a length of small metal tubing coming out the top that lets you squeeze out very small drops.

I use one with a short length of tubing for oil when I'm sawing or when drilling harder metals like steel. Another bottle I found in a plastics store has a longer length of metal tubing on it. Plastics people use them for dispensing fast drying glues to join pieces of acrylic. The long metal tube let's you reach into tight places. Either of these is handy for flux at the soldering station.

If you have a Foredom flexshaft, it makes sense to check it over every so often to be sure it's running properly. But how to do that? You've probably lost the little booklet that came with the unit. Well, being the good company it is, Foredom has put together an extensive set of videos on how to everything.

Any repair parts needed are available on the Foredom site or from most jewelry supply catalogs. If you have any question about their products, a phone call or an email will get quick answers.



Meteor Shower Alert ~



Orionid meteors fly each year between about October 2 to November 7. That's when Earth is passing through the stream of debris left behind by Comet Halley, the parent comet of the Orionid shower. The Orionids usually put out the greatest number of meteors in the few hours before dawn. And the expected peak morning in 2021 is October 21. Bad news for Orionid fans this year, though. The 2021 full Hunter's Moon will be October 19-20. That means moonlight will flood the sky all night, or nearly all night, during the Orionids' peak.

But you might see an Orionid meteor at any time during October, assuming you're a dark location, with a sky free of moonlight.

The term meteor shower might give you the idea of a rain shower. But particularly known for storming (producing unexpected, very rich displays). From a dark location, in a year when the moon is out of the way, you might see 10 to 20 Orionids per hour at their peak. Will you see that many in 2021? Not likely. There's always the element of uncertainty and possible surprise when it comes to meteor showers. But no one expects that many Orionids to overcome the moon's glare, during 2021's shower. If you do see any Orionids in 2021, note that they're known to be extremely fast meteors, plummeting into the Earth's atmosphere at about 41 miles (66 km) per second. The meteors in this shower are on the faint side. But they make up for their faintness by leaving trains, or ionized gas trails that last for a few seconds after the meteor itself has gone. Maybe half of the Orionid meteors leave persistent trains. Also, sometimes, an Orionid meteor can be exceptionally bright and break up into fragments. The bright star near the radiant point is Betelgeuse. Keep looking UP!
