Rhea has called around to many places and found most too small and some hard to load in and out. The Bessemer Civic Center, which has the amenities we need, is available. Reggie Bolton moved that we put a deposit down for Labor Day week -end, Don Hill seconded and the motion passed. Rhea will take them a check on Monday 10/14.

It's time to apply for annual scholarships. The judging committee is Casey Faulkner, Kristen Osborne, and Anthony Piazza aided by Sandra Sullivan who has a lot of experience in this. The application is on the website and the Rockhound Roundup and is due at the November meeting. They will be awarded at the December meeting.

Minutes of AMLS Board meeting 10/24/24

John Cook proposed that each committee chair send a report to the president each month to be put in the Rockhound Roundup. If there is nothing to report, report that.

Annual reports for each committee are due at the November meeting. Each outgoing officer should send these to the president.

The audit committee is to report at the November meeting. Reggie has worked with Larry Hensley to complete the financial spreadsheet. Reggie has e-mailed that and the last few year's bookkeeping to John Wild who is working on a 2025 budget.

John Cook reported that we can set up a website with WIX for around \$360 per year. That amount includes software we might need. It has many modules that should suit our purposes. Rhea needs to get on the checking account for her signature; she and Levan will work on this. We believe John Wild is still on from his stint as club president otherwise he will need to be added as well.

Levan agreed to fill in for first VP duties to assist Anthony Piazza with programs.

Going forward, each member, new and old, will be asked to identify with a committee to encourage participation. Rick suggested adding this to the membership form. New memberships were put on hold temporarily but will begin again on November 1.

AMLS Joe and Frances Kontzen Scholarship

This scholarship may be awarded annually at the December meeting to a member of AMLS chosen by a special Scholarship Committee. It is given in memory of Joe and Frances Kontzen, longtime AMLS members and friends.

- a. Purpose. The scholarship is for one week's class attendance at either William Holland Lapidary School or Wildacres Retreat during one of the workshops sponsored by the Southeast Federation of Mineralogical Societies (SFMS) or the Eastern Federation of Mineralogical and Lapidary Societies (EFMLS). The amount of the scholarship shall equal the double occupancy room rate at the school chosen by the Awardees.
- b. Funding. The scholarship will be funded by proceeds from the annual gem show, augmented by the General Fund if necessary. Payment will be made to the appropriate organization.
- c. Committee. The Scholarship Committee consists of a Chairman and two members, plus the President as ex-officio member. The President selects the Chairman at the July meeting, and the membership selects the other two committee members at the August meeting.
- d. Application Process. Notices to apply for the Scholarship will appear in the September newsletter. The Chairman will mail applications to members upon request. Applications will also be published on the AMLS web site for downloading, and be made available at the August, September, October, and November meetings. Application deadline is the November meeting.
- e. Selection Process. The Chairman is responsible for collecting applications, organizing the Committee's selection meeting(s), and selecting the Scholarship Awardees (and an Alternate if necessary).
- f. Class Selection. The Awardees will select a class from those available classes sponsored by the SFMS or EFMLS during the year following the award. The Scholarship must be used during that year, and is not transferable. If it is determined that the Awardee cannot use the Scholarship for any reason, the Scholarship will go to the Alternate selected by the Committee.
